Someone could bump pot or pull it over.

Someone could slip

Using on hot pan moisture can turn to steam & burn.

Hot pad could catch on fire.

Suds hide knife and someone could get cut.

Danger of fire spreading

Danger of being cut from sharp edge of lid.

Someone could bump their head.

Pot handle could get hot & danger of being burned.

Bagel could catch on fire.

Dishcloth could catch on fire.

Danger of electrocution

Someone could mistake ammonia for milk.

Unplug and remove bagel.

Don't put non-food items in food containers.

Remove lid completely.

Keep hot pads away from burners.

Always use dry hot pads.

Keep all doors and drawers closed.

Cover with lid, use salt or use fire extinguisher.

Wash sharp objects separately.

Use a pot holder and never leave on pot.

Unplug and use away from water.

Clean up spills immediately.
