

Instructional Videos

You have been studying the growth and development patterns that take place from four to six years of age. In chapter thirteen it covered various topics that children this age are beginning to learn. By now you know that children this age need very specific instructions to complete a task; in addition, visual cues and examples are necessary for them to learn.

In groups of three, you will be composing an instructional video for children ages four to six (think Kindergarteners!). One person in your group will be designated the 'Director', this person's job will be to hand in a typed copy of the script and also be responsible for filming the video and emailing to me. The two other group members will appear in the video in some way; they could act as two instructors, one could talk, while the other performs directions; you could also do it in the format of an adult giving directions and a child following. You get to decide how you want your video to be carried out.

The topics we will be covering are:

Washing Hands

Setting & Clearing the Table

Zippering and Buttoning

Brushing & Flossing

Choosing Clothes & Dressing

Tie Shoes

I will assign each group a topic and you will have TWO days in class to write your scripts, practice, and finally record your video. You may want to try it a few times in order to get a quality product. These videos will be shown to the Kindergarten class, who will then vote for a winner!

Remember, children this age need specific instructions, simple instructions, and a little fun never hurt either!
