

Lesson Duration:

- Day 1: Watch video, read instructions, plan color scheme
- Day 2: create marbling project
- Day 3: Set project with iron & student evaluation

Objectives:

Students will be able to:

- demonstrate primary colors, secondary colors, color schemes, etc.
- demonstrate the elements of design

Supplies:

- Shaving cream (cheap from Dollar Tree)
- Plastic spoons
- Foil Tray
- Fabric piece (cotton, linen or duck cloth works best)
- Painters Tape
- Puff paint (Tulip brand works great)
- Unused pencils
- Wooden/Plastic rulers
- Plastic bags (Walmart bags)
- Plastic table cloths

Teacher Notes:

- I purchased [zipper canvas bags](#) from Amazon for my students to use. You could use just a piece of fabric and have them create a project afterward with it.
- Buy cheap shaving cream and foil pans from Dollar Tree
- Students really enjoyed creating this project.

Instructions:

*Cover the table with a plastic tablecloth. Work in partners.

*Make sure you've watched the [instructional video](#) BEFORE you try.

1. Shake the shaving cream up and put some on the tray.
2. Spread the shaving cream using the spoon making sure to get the edges of the tray or making sure that the work surface will cover your fabric.
3. *YOU ONLY NEED A THIN LAYER - NOT THAT MUCH!!!!*
4. Gently squeeze a thin stream of puff paint on the shaving cream.
 - a. 3 colors seem to work the best
 - b. You decide where to put the colors
5. With the eraser end of the pencil or spoon (DON'T GO ALL WAY TO THE BOTTOM and hit the tray) Swirl, make lines with the paint and shaving cream
 - a. **DO NOT OVERMIX THE COLORS** together you only need to mix the blend them.
So you can see the distinct colors
6. Take your piece of fabric and lay it down in the paint/ shaving cream
 - a. Once you lay it down you cannot pick it up again.
7. Rub the fabric all over, until you see the colors starting to seep through.
 - a. Should take about 30 seconds.
8. Peel the fabric off the shaving cream
9. Put on a plastic bag
10. HOLD one end of the fabric and with the other hand using the ruler SCRAPE all the shaving cream and paint off - can be thrown in the trash or down the drain.
11. Let dry
12. IRON once it is dry to set the color. (let dry overnight)
